## Access to Care



**\$1,306,500** in grants awarded to breast cancer patients through various organizations to cover treatment costs

**\$5,273,515** provided through free drug program for breast cancer patients

**143,338** calls answered on 24/7 nurse triage line

**2,442** calls answered on 24/7 COVID-19 line



## Summa Health Cancer Institute Outpatient Support Services:

**834** patients received social work services

**1,386** patients received financial navigation

**884** patients received massage therapy



**706** patients received nutritional services

**149** wigs provided to patients

**1,588** patients received patient navigation services

Community Health Workers conducted **1,386** home visits addressing social determinants of health

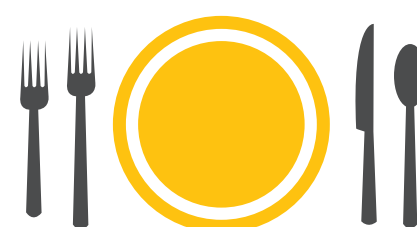
## Volunteer Program

## How Are We Helping Our Environment?



Decreased consumption of electric and natural gas at hospitals

**44 percent** from 2008 to 2022, according to the Greenhouse Gas (GHG) analysis

Locked energy price in 2022 had an Economic Value Added of **more than \$2.8 million**
