

Joe Acker is currently the Executive
Director of the Birmingham Regional
Emergency Medical Services System
(BREMSS). BREMSS provides EMS system
coordination to seven counties, 1.5 million
residents, 210 different EMS agencies
with over 1500 ALS personnel and 1000
BLS personnel and 19 hospitals with over

20,000 responses a month. BREMSS also operates a trauma system (4,000 patients), stroke system (2,000 patients per year), STEMI system (600 patients per year) which routes patients to "Real Time" trauma, stroke and STEMI-ready hospitals. Previously, Joe served as the first State EMS Director for the state of Tennessee. BREMSS received the National Mitertek/Harvard award in 2006 for the most innovative program in Homeland Security.

Michael D. Mackan, MD, FACEP

June 3, 1947 - November 6, 2011

Dr. Michael Mackan was a highly respected leader and visionary in medical education and emergency medical services. In his 30 years at Akron City Hospital, he served as medical director for 10 local fire departments and 4 private ambulance services in the region. Dr. Mackan was the chair of the EMS Committee for the Ohio Chapter of the American College of Emergency Physicians. He was instrumental in the development and implementation of the Ohio Trauma Triage guidelines, and was chair of the EMS Regional Physicians Advisory Board. His lifetime of dedication to prehospital care earned him the EMS Star Life Award from the Ohio Chapter of American College of Emergency Physicians.

This conference is held in honor of the beloved Dr. Mackan to continue his great passion and dedication to medical education.
