At Summa, we've defined our change as moving from a hospital company to becoming a population health management organization that delivers value-based healthcare to the one million people we serve in our marketplace.



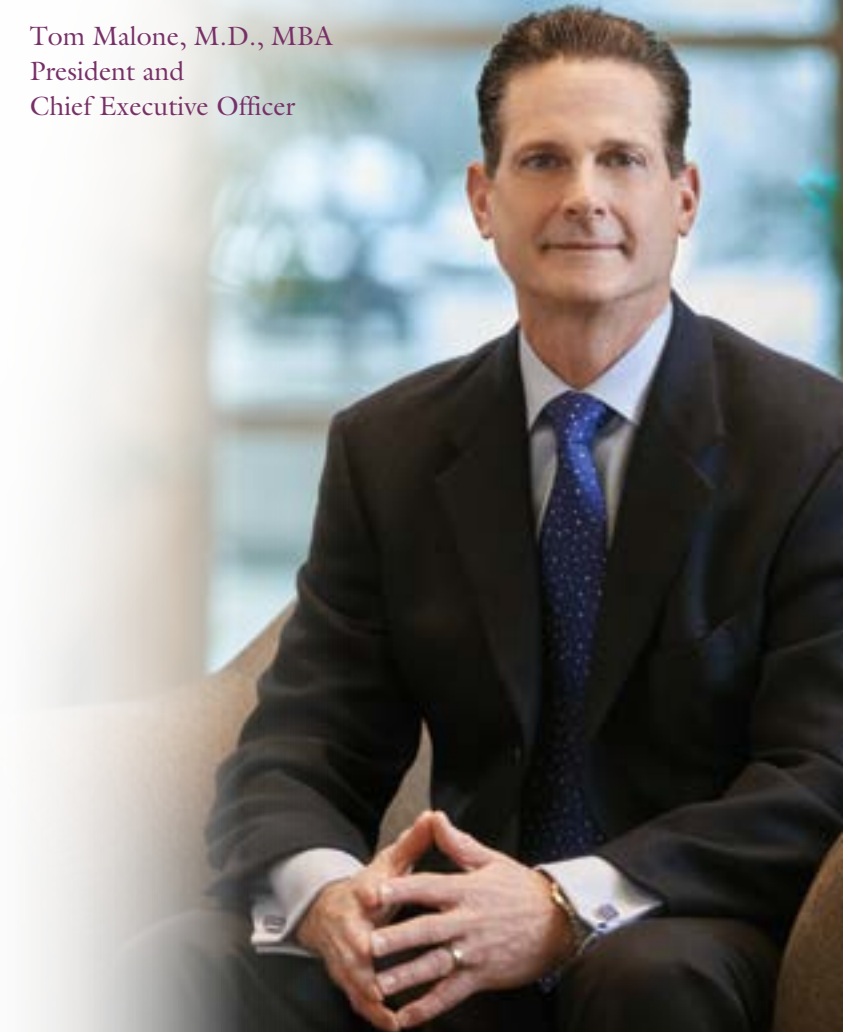

Akron City Hospital was founded in 1892 to provide a place where patients could be treated with compassion, coupled with the best principles of medical practice.

From the first accredited radiology department in the country to the first adult open heart surgery in Akron (and one of the first in the country), Summa Akron City Hospital has achieved national recognition as a provider of quality, compassionate healthcare.

Summa Akron City Hospital is designated as an accredited Chest Pain Center by the Society of Cardiovascular Patient Care (SCPC) and is a Certified Stroke Center. In addition, the hospital received the American Heart Association's (AHA) Mission Lifeline: Gold Plus Receiving Quality Achievement Award for implementing specific quality improvement measures as outlined by AHA for the treatment of patients who suffer severe heart attacks.

Summa Akron City Hospital is an academic medical center with 14 multispecialty residency programs and six fellowship programs to train northeast Ohio's next generation of healthcare providers. Approximately 80 residents and fellows graduate from Summa Akron City Hospital's medical education programs each year.

A Level I Trauma Center, Summa Akron City Hospital expanded its emergency department (ED) in 2012. The renovated ED provides more than 100,000 square feet and 76 patient beds and is equipped to serve more than 80,000 patients annually. The ED also offers specialized emergency services for geriatric patients to best treat the area's growing senior population.

Through the kindness of Richard M. and Yvonne Hamlin, Summa announced in 2013 the largest philanthropic gift in the organization's history: a \$4 million contribution for the creation of a hybrid cardiovascular operating room (OR) at Summa Akron City Hospital. The Richard M. and Yvonne Hamlin Hybrid Operating Room Suite includes the dual functionality of a traditional operating room and cardiac catheterization lab allowing Summa Cardiovascular Institute to offer new procedures to heart patients and perform existing procedures with the latest cardiothoracic, interventional and vascular surgery technology. The Hybrid Operating Room Suite began treating patients in the fall of 2014. In December 2014, Summa completed Summit County's first Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR) surgery. Summa Akron City Hospital is the first hospital between Cleveland and Columbus to offer this minimally invasive surgical procedure.

Summa Barberton Hospital has served residents of Barberton and the surrounding communities since its founding in 1915. In December 2007, Summa Barberton Hospital became a full member of Summa Health System. The hospital is located approximately 10 miles southwest of Akron.

Summa Barberton Hospital combines the comfort of an accessible community hospital with the latest advancements in medical care. The hospital provides the community with easy access to comprehensive, high-quality cancer services at the Commission on Cancer accredited Parkview Center, as well as the full spectrum of cardiovascular disease care including diagnostic, interventional and surgical services.

Summa Barberton Hospital is focused on expanding its facilities and programming to meet the needs of the growing community. In 2013, the hospital opened a new emergency department (ED) and increased its original facility space to 32,000 square feet and 46 patient areas. Summa Barberton Hospital also recently established several new programs

for the geriatric population, adding an Acute Care for Elders (ACE) Unit, an Acute Palliative Care Unit (APCU) and inpatient consults for geriatric assessments to its service offerings.

In 2013, Summa Barberton Hospital successfully underwent rigorous review by the Society of Cardiovascular Patient Care (SCPC) to meet a specific set of quality care criteria for the treatment of cardiac patients. The hospital is designated as an accredited Chest Pain Center by the SCPC, recognizing that Summa Barberton Hospital meets or exceeds quality of care measures for people experiencing symptoms of heart attack.

Originally operated by the Sisters of Charity of Saint Augustine as a non-denominational, non-profit general hospital with 164 beds, Summa St. Thomas Hospital opened its doors to the Akron community in 1922. St. Thomas merged with Akron City Hospital to become Summa Health System in 1989.

Summa St. Thomas Hospital was the first in the country to recognize the medical aspects of alcoholism as a disease and is the founding location of Alcoholics Anonymous. The hospital opened the nation's first alcoholism treatment ward and continues this longstanding dedication today.

Continuing the tradition of innovative behavioral health services, Summa St. Thomas Hospital is the headquarters of the Summa Center for Behavioral Health. The center serves residents of Summit, Portage, Medina and Stark counties and operates specialized programming to treat specific behavioral health concerns including the Center for the Treatment and Study of Traumatic Stress and Ignatia Hall Intensive Outpatient and Opiate Treatment Programs.

Western Reserve Hospital is a teaching affiliate of the Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine (OU-HCOM) and the Centers of Osteopathic Research and Education (CORE) and offers seven accredited osteopathic residency programs.



Summa Rehab Hospital, a joint venture between Summa Health System and Vibra Healthcare, is a 60-bed acute medical facility providing a rehabilitation regimen based on the specific needs of each patient. The freestanding facility is dedicated to inpatient rehabilitation by a multidisciplinary team comprised of physicians; nurses; physical, occupational, speech and recreational therapists and case management workers. The hospital is accredited by the Joint Commission and The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

Summa has installed and implemented the most current technologies available in the rehabilitation field, including:

- Body weight supported treadmill training and therapy for locomotor recovery
- Active assisted motion technology for upper and lower limb recovery
- Vital stimulation for swallowing
- Car transfer simulated system

Highlights of the freestanding, fully-dedicated rehabilitation hospital:

- All private rooms with private baths on two levels
- Rehab gym totaling more than 5,000 square feet with two-story elevation; natural light for improved healing and quality of life
- Private treatment space on two levels

- Bedside dialysis capability in all rooms

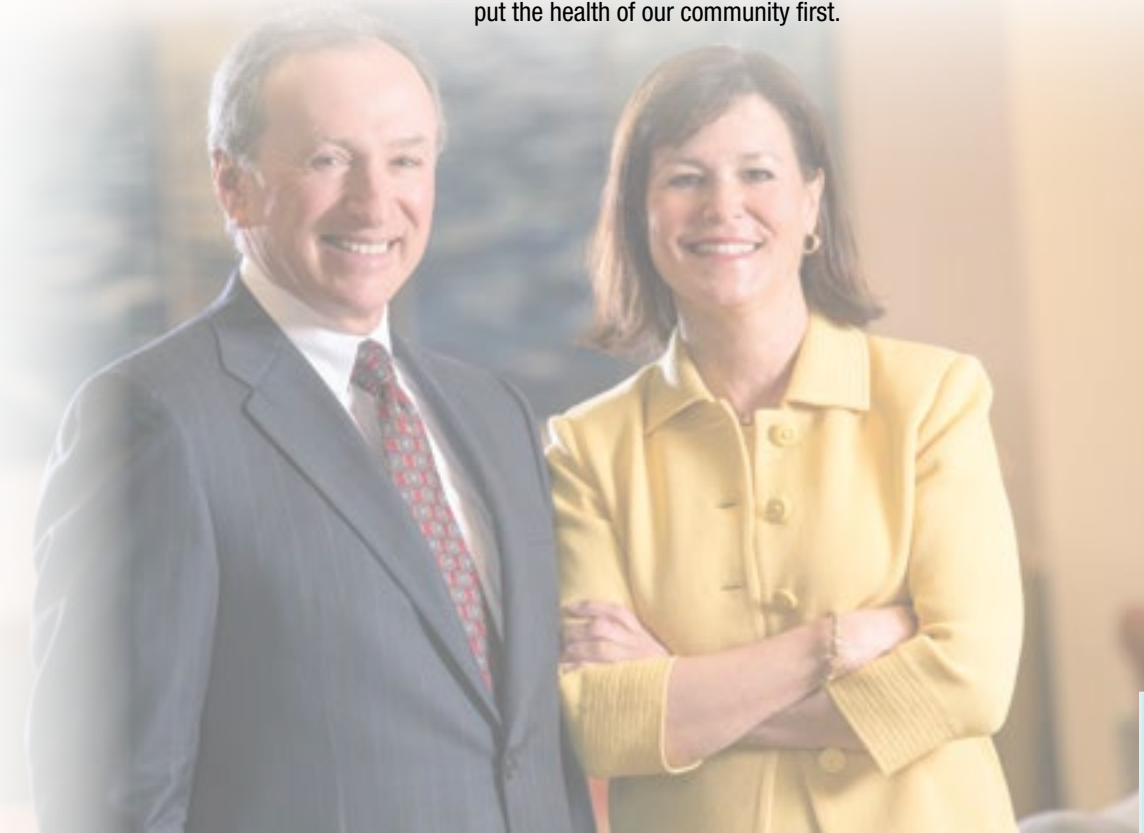

Government Relations and Health Policy

Summa's Government Relations and Health Policy department is dedicated to elevating Summa Health as a leader in the public sector among those responsible for determining the future of healthcare in Ohio and throughout the nation.

By actively building and enhancing public sector relationships at the local, regional, state and federal government levels, the department works to advance Summa's leadership in health policy advocacy including, but not limited to, issues such as Medicare, Medicaid, insurance reform and medical education and research.

Community Benefit & Diversity

The Community Benefit and Diversity department leads efforts to address health disparities and other important community needs, and to raise awareness of health and healthcare issues affecting the communities served by Summa Health.

Center for Health Equity

The Center for Health Equity at Summa Center at New Seasons opened in March 2012 with a goal to provide outstanding, quality care and identify, reduce and eventually eliminate health disparities to achieve health equity. The services and activities provided at the center have involved collaborations with nearly two dozen organizations and area businesses including Minority Behavioral Health Group and the Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services.

Programs at the center have included free diabetes support groups with educational presentations; Q&A sessions by a wide array of health professionals; Medicaid enrollment opportunities; CPR demonstrations; nutrition/cooking classes; line dancing classes; a fatherhood walk and policy/advocacy meetings.

Impact on Region

Summa contributes \$2.73 billion in business volume impact to the Ohio economy and an additional \$83.1 million in state government revenue impact. Summa Health helps employ more than 24,840 individuals on a direct and indirect basis, proving to be a vital member of the regional economy.

Summa Health Network represents nearly 1,700 providers throughout Summa Health's member hospitals. Summa Health Network contracts with national and regional payers on behalf of its provider and hospital members. With membership opportunities for physicians, advance practice nurses, optometrists, chiropractors, podiatrists, and physician assistants, Summa Health Network serves as a mechanism to effectively align and engage community providers with Summa Health while preparing and advancing providers into value-based agreements with Summa Health's accountable care organization, NewHealth Collaborative.

Summa Health Network allows for provider choice regarding participation in approximately 20 Messenger Model payer agreements among commercial, Medicare and Medicaid payer networks, for an enhanced provider experience. Along with simplified credentialing and efficient demographic update processes, provider members gain the support of the Summa Health Network Provider Operations team for payer compliance assistance and claims issue resolution. Provider members and their staff are also offered participation in over 10 educational seminars and events throughout the year relating to coding efficiencies and payer updates along with access to Summa Health's Learning Center.

In support of the transition to value-based agreements, Summa Health Network also offers its provider members financial assistance with NCQA Patient-Centered Medical Home recognition and a complete EMR implementation program with a preferred EMR vendor.



Utilizing healthcare information technology makes it possible for Summa Health Network to partner with payers in performance initiatives that compensate physicians for the quality care they deliver to payer members.





An accountable care organization (ACO) is a group of providers and suppliers of services (hospitals, physicians and others involved in patient care) that work together to coordinate care. An ACO is a patient-centered organization where the patient and providers are true partners in healthcare decisions.

NewHealth Collaborative (NHC) was launched in 2011 with the vision to become a clinician-led ACO that partners with communities to compassionately care for and serve its populations in an accountable, value- and evidence-based manner. NHC was designed to transition from a “sick” model of care to a “well” model of care; one that rewards a combined focus on high-quality care, great patient experience and low costs.

Today, NHC represents more than 500 physicians and integrates the resources of four Summa owned, affiliated and joint venture hospitals and Mercy Medical Center. NHC and its providers serve 13,000 SummaCare Medicare Advantage members, 6,000 Summa employees, 28,000 traditional Medicare beneficiaries, 32,000 Medical Mutual of Ohio members and 6,000 Humana members. NHC is currently managing a total medical spend of approximately \$700 million.

Summa continually seeks new technology and treatment options for some of today’s most serious medical conditions – work that will ultimately improve and transform the way patients throughout the community, region, nation and world receive care.

Summa manages \$7 million annually in support of clinical research programs across various disciplines. Many research programs are supported by grants or contracts from federal and state funding agencies. Collaborative research programs exist between Summa and its academic partners including Northeast Ohio Medical University (NEOMED), the University of Akron, Kent State University and the Austen BioInnovation Institute in Akron (ABIA).

As a leader in medical education, Summa Health System supports the education of its physicians and healthcare professionals. Summa Akron City and St. Thomas Hospitals are teaching affiliates of the Northeast Ohio Medical University (NEOMED) and include a staff of more than 1,200 physicians and accredited residency and fellowship programs that foster a dynamic medical environment.

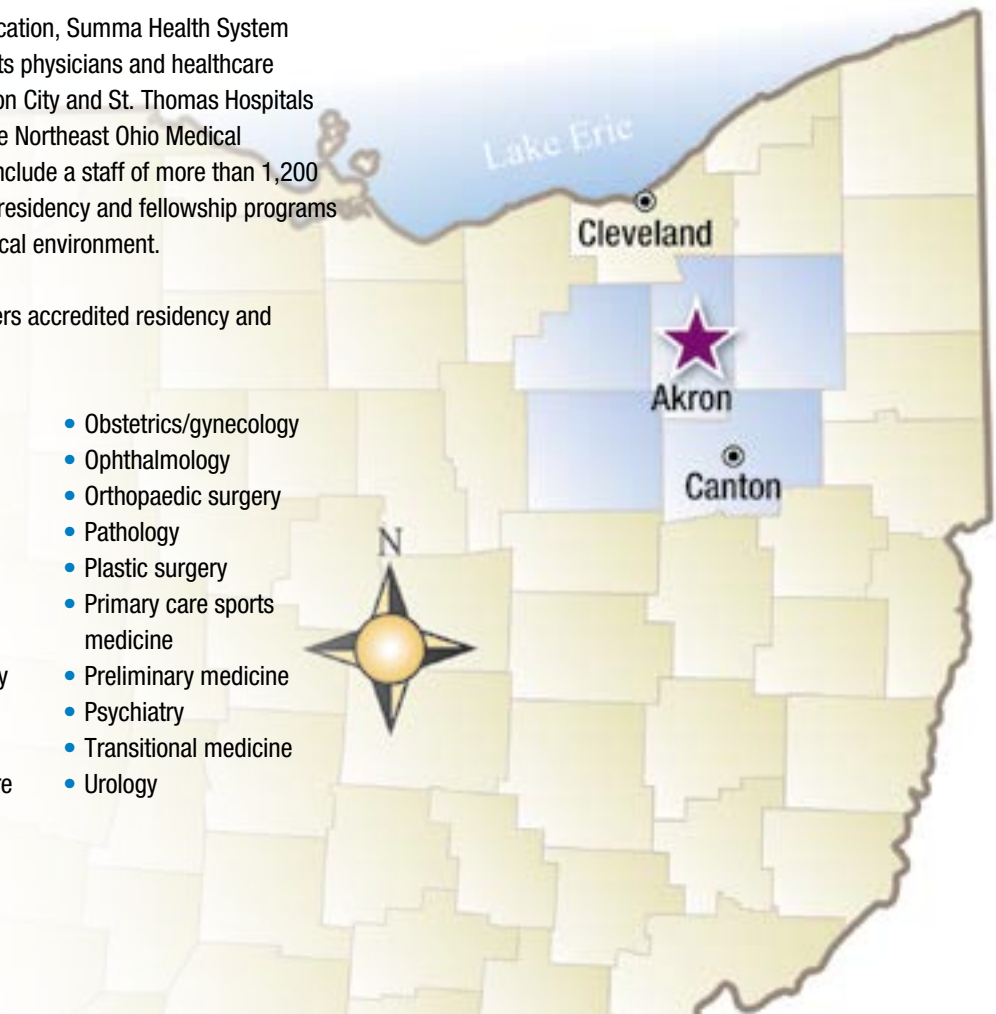

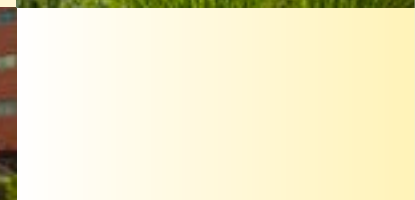
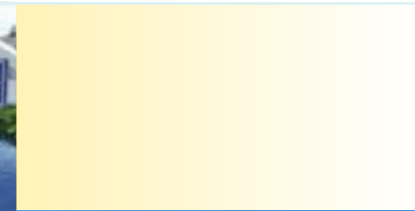
